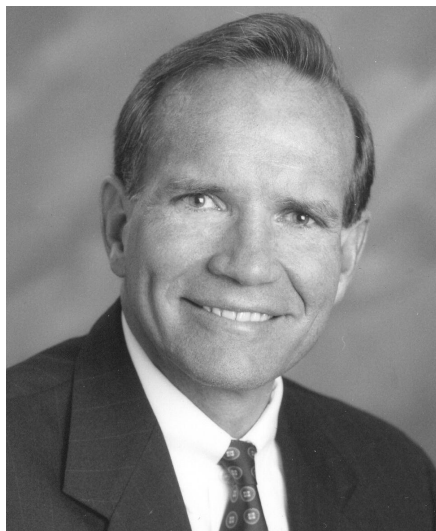


# Clyde B. McDowell

Though he served in this capacity for only two and a half years, his legacy lives on through our integrated educational model in which leaders are formed through mentoring relationships, which intentionally form competencies and character along with the academic content. As president, Dr. McDowell also helped Denver Seminary expand its focus to the international level. Today, his dream is becoming a reality.

Today, Denver Seminary has approximately 900 students, 10 percent of whom are from 22 countries outside the U.S. Two-thirds of our international students are from the 10/40 window, a region home to more than two-thirds of the world's population, 95 percent of whom are unevangelized. As our campus becomes increasingly more diverse in the future, gifts to endowed scholarship funds like this one are vital for equipping international leaders.
